Dear Mr. Taglieri:

This letter is in response to the administrative appeal that you have submitted to the Mayor pursuant to the District of Columbia Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA"), D.C. Code §§ 2-531, *et seq.* In your appeal, you challenged the response of the Metropolitan Police Department ("MPD") to your July 2, 2020 FOIA request, identified as 2020-FOIA-06314, which sought photographs taken by officers responding to a motor vehicle collision in which you were involved.

On July 7, 2020, MPD denied your request because, "[a]bsent authorization and/or waiver, a release of such records would constitute...a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy and is exempt from disclosure pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(2) and (a)(3)(C)." In your appeal, a signed release was provided.

Based on the foregoing, we remand this matter to MPD to promptly disclose the requested records.

This constitutes the final decision of this Office. You may challenge MPD's subsequent response, or lack thereof, by separate appeal to this Office. If you are dissatisfied with this decision, you may commence a civil action against the District of Columbia in the Superior Court of the District of Columbia in accordance with D.C. Code § 2-537.
