Dear Mr. Mohsen:

This letter responds to the administrative appeal you submitted to the Mayor under the District of Columbia Freedom of Information Act, D.C. Code § 2-537 (“DC FOIA”), challenging the response from the Office of Unified Communications (“OUC”) to your September 8, 2020, FOIA request, in which you sought records of a 911 call.

OUC initially was unable to process your request because, in its view, you did not describe the records you were seeking with adequate specificity. You appealed, challenging that determination. In reviewing your appeal, an attorney at OUC contacted you and took down additional information regarding your request.<sup>1</sup> This additional information enabled OUC to locate the 911 call you sought. After review of the call, on October 6, 2020, OUC transmitted the 911 call to you via email.

Because OUC has now provided you with documents responsive to your request, your appeal is dismissed as moot.

If you are unsatisfied with the OUC’s document production, you may file a new appeal once you have had an opportunity to review the records provided by the agency.

This constitutes the final decision of this Office. If you are dissatisfied with this decision, you may commence a civil action against the District of Columbia in the Superior Court of the District of Columbia in accordance with D.C. Code § 2-537.
