RE: FOIA Appeals 2022-105 & 2022-108

Dear Ms. Konigsburg:

This letter responds to the administrative appeals you submitted to the Mayor under the District of Columbia Freedom of Information Act, D.C. Code § 2-537 ("DC FOIA"), challenging the lack of response from the Metropolitan Police Department ("MPD") to your DC FOIA requests.

You submitted 3 DC FOIA requests to MPD seeking various records regarding Lewis Crowe Park and the Valero shopping center. On March 21, 2022, you submitted 2 appeals to this Office challenging MPD's lack of response to your 3 requests. On March 24, 2022, we notified MPD of your appeals and requested responses. On March 31, 2022, MPD submitted a consolidated response. In its response, MPD stated that it explained to you that searches of its Records Management System yielded no responsive records. MPD also informed this Office that it provided you information on how to "track crime in [your] neighborhood using DC Crime Cards at <https://dcatlas.dcgis.dc.gov/crimecards/> and MPD Online Community Groups."

Because your appeals only challenged MPD's failure to respond and MPD has notified you it has no responsive records, we dismiss these appeals as moot.

This constitutes the final decision of this Office. If you are dissatisfied with this decision, you may commence a civil action against the District of Columbia in the Superior Court of the District of Columbia in accordance with D.C. Code § 2-537.
